The Asian Development Bank–Japan Scholarship (ADB–JSP)

The Asian Development Bank-Japan Scholarship program provides full scholarship support for Master's degree study in ADB-JSP approved fields of study at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa and for participation in the educational, residential, and leadership development programs at the East-West Center. The scholarship includes round-trip airfare from home country, full tuition and fees, housing at the East-West Center, a book allowance, health insurance and a monthly stipend.

ADB-JSP was established to strengthen human resource capacity in Asian Development Bank developing member countries. After completing their studies, scholars are expected to return to their home countries to apply and share their new knowledge and skills to promote socioeconomic development.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Be a citizen and current resident of a developing member country of the Asian Development Bank and not more than 35 years old at the time of application.
- Have a 4-year bachelor's degree or the equivalent of a 4-year Bachelor's degree, at the time of application. Have at least 2 years of full-time professional work experience after a university degree at the time of application.
- Applicants must be living or working in their home country at the time of application and participation.

The East-West Center Graduate Degree Fellowship provides up to two years of master's or doctoral funding for graduate students from Asia, the Pacific, and the United States to participate in educational, cultural, residential community building, and leadership development programs at the East-West Center while pursuing graduate study at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa (UHM).

The East-West Center Graduate Degree Fellowship begins in early- to mid-August with the Community Building Institute (CBI), which includes time for advising and registration at the University of Hawai'i. All incoming EWC students are required to participate in this initial program, including those who are currently residing in Hawai'i.

EWC fellowships provide much more than funding. They equip and transform students into emerging leaders with the relationships and regional literacy required to meet the evolving demands of global change.



EWC graduate students live, learn, and work together, engaging in student-led programs that promote cross-cultural and interdisciplinary problem solving. Graduate Degree Fellows are a select cohort dedicated to academic excellence, public service, and positive change in the Indo-Pacific region.

The Graduate Degree Fellowship covers:
