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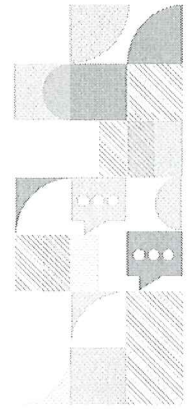

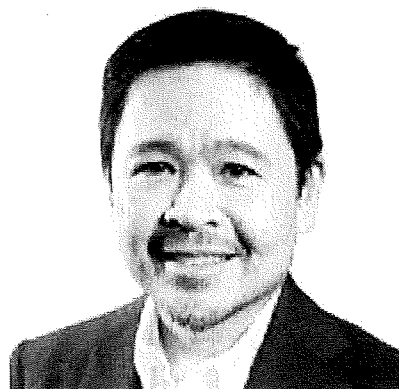

As the higher education market continues to mature across the Asia-Pacific region, graduate employability and alumni engagement are becoming important measures of universities' success that can improve reputation, while also emerging as critical factors in accreditation.

Graduate employability – Universities need to focus on high-impact initiatives on people, processes, technology and collaborations within their career services in order to foster strong partnerships with industry members and help graduates overcome barriers and get good career opportunities.

Alumni engagement – Alumni are a university's untapped resource. Universities should use alumni's experiences to build an extended community and build meaningful connections with graduates through coaching, mentoring and hiring.

Measuring talent employability readiness – Tools such as SeeMeCV's Maturity and Readiness Assessment (MARA) survey can be used to assess how well a university's student career service is functioning, and benchmark it against industry and international standards.
