



- To promote universal peace and international understanding through education.


HISTORY

The founding members included 51 universities from 11 countries, namely Australia, China, India, Indonesia, Japan, South Korea, Malaysia, New Zealand, Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam. Professor Dr. Wichit Srisa-an served as the Founding President of AUAP, while Professor Dr. Ruben C. Umaly was appointed as the Founding Secretary General. The AUAP Secretariat is located in Thailand.




THE PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENTS (2023-2024)





















IN MEMORIAM
