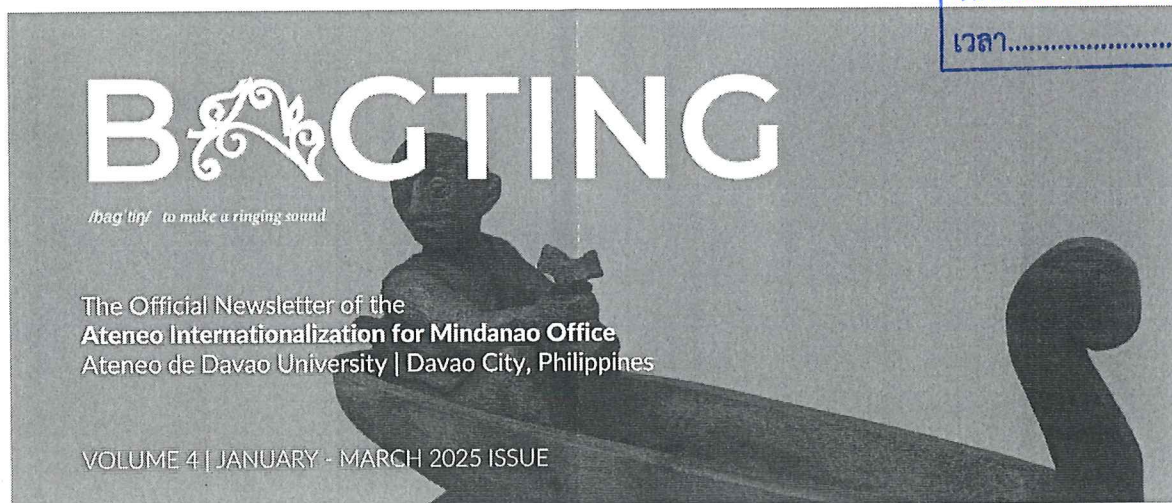

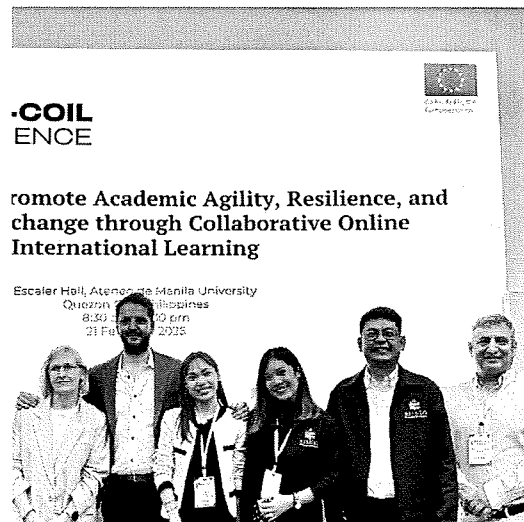

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ADDU Expands International Engagement at the Global Citizenship Convention in Mexico

Ateneo de Davao University (ADDU) participated in the Global Citizenship Convention hosted by its partner institution, Universidad Iberoamericana Torreón, in Mexico from 27 to 30 January 2025.

With the theme “The World is Our House,” the convention aimed to strengthen institutional partnerships, promote academic mobility and cultural immersion, and deepen the understanding of global citizenship in higher education. This event aligns with Universidad Iberoamericana Torreón’s Institutional Strategy 2032, which highlights internationalization as one of its fundamental pillars.

Representatives from 23 universities across Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, Colombia, El Salvador, the United States, the Philippines, France, Guatemala, Italy, and Mexico had the opportunity to engage with students, faculty members, staff, and administrators from academic institutions in Torreón. ADDU was represented by Mr. Romulo Vinci R. Bueza, Director of the Ateneo Internationalization for Mindanao (AIM) Office, and Ms. Lyd Ejira C. Ducusin, AIM Assistant Director. They showcased ADDU’s academic programs as well as curated experiential learning programs like the international service-learning, Mindanao study visits, and other mobility programs. These programs garnered significant interest from Universidad Iberoamericana Torreón’s community, eager to engage in meaningful global learning experiences in Southern Mindanao, Philippines.

The convention also provided valuable opportunities for networking. ADDU representatives connected with participating institutions such as the Universidad Católica del Uruguay (Uruguay), University of Regina (Canada), Universidad Centroamericana José Simeón Cañas (El Salvador), Universidad Católica de Córdoba (Argentina), Lorenzo de’ Medici – The Italian International Institute (Italy), University of Arizona (USA), Universidad Rafael Landívar (Guatemala), Universidade do Vale do Rio dos Sinos (Brazil), Loyola University Chicago (USA), Canisius University (USA), Universidad Iberoamericana León (Mexico), Universidad Alberto Hurtado (Chile), and more. These interactions fostered discussions on potential collaborations, student exchange programs, and other academic partnerships.

Furthermore, the convention featured interactive booths, keynote lectures, panel discussions, and cultural showcases. Discussions throughout the event focused on institutionalizing international partnerships and developing effective student mobility strategies to enhance global engagement.

As part of these discussions, Mr. Bueza delivered a presentation on “People, Place, and Purpose in Internationalizing Higher Education,” where he shared ADDU’s strategic

internationalization framework. To further situate the discussion, he introduced the longstanding historical ties between the Philippines and Mexico. This connection, forged centuries ago during the Manila-Acapulco Galleon Trade, provides a powerful example of how cultural exchange and collaboration can transcend geographic and temporal boundaries.

In addition, Mr. Bueza then presented the importance of grounding internationalization efforts in people, place, and purpose while considering Mindanao's historical, cultural, and socio-political realities. As a Jesuit institution, he noted that ADDU has embraced this approach by aligning its academic and outreach initiatives with the needs of Mindanao while also connecting these efforts to the global stage. Finally, he encouraged participants to reimagine internationalization not as an abstract concept but as a process that uplifts people, respects place, and serves a higher purpose.

Beyond academic discussions and networking sessions, the convention celebrated cultural diversity through city tours and cultural performances. On the last day, in his closing address, Universidad Iberoamericana Torreón's President, Mtro. Juan Luis Hernández Avendaño asserted his institution's commitment to internationalization and expressed gratitude to the international delegates for their contributions and engagement.

As Ateneo de Davao continues to champion strategic internationalization, the Global Citizenship Convention was a resounding success, bringing together academic institutions and promising a future of expanding global partnerships. ADDU extends its heartfelt gratitude to Universidad Iberoamericana Torreón for the opportunity to be part of this global initiative.

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AJCU-AP and ADDU Open New Cycle of Interdisciplinary Academic Pairings Across the Asia-Pacific

The Association of Jesuit Colleges and Universities in Asia Pacific (AJCU-AP), through Ateneo de Davao University, continues to strengthen international academic collaboration through the Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL) Program. This new cycle features a wide range of interdisciplinary courses involving partner institutions from Indonesia, the Philippines, Taiwan, and Malaysia.

COIL provides a transformative platform where faculty and students engage in meaningful cross-cultural academic exchange through virtual modalities. For this second iteration of the program, diverse pairings have been facilitated.

One of the ongoing COIL classes involves a pairing between **Ateneo de Davao University, Philippines, and Fu Jen Catholic University, Taiwan**. The two institutions jointly offer a course on *Introduction to Language, Society, and Culture and Freshman English (Advanced)* beginning 26 February 2025, guided by Dr. Josyl Aquilam and Dr. Tammy Hsu.

In the field of theology, a *Christology* course developed by **Sanata Dharma University, Indonesia, and Ateneo de Davao University, Philippines** commenced on 11 March 2025. Dr. Bernardus Agus Rukiyanto, SJ, and Dr. Roawie Quimba facilitated this class, inviting students into deep theological reflection across cultures.

In the area of health and physical education, **INTI International University, Malaysia**, and **Ateneo de Manila University, Philippines**, collaborated on a joint module titled *Cardiorespiratory Physiotherapy 1 and Functional Training*. This course, led by Ms. Dina Adam and Mr. Alvin George C. Cobar, began on 25 March 2025 and combined perspectives from health sciences and applied fitness.

Scheduled for implementation in the upcoming semester is a collaboration between **Universitas Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta, Indonesia**, and **Ateneo de Manila University, Philippines**. This pairing will feature courses in *Banking and Microeconomic Theory*, which aims to broaden students' understanding of financial systems in Southeast Asia through the expertise of Dr. Dimas Bagus Wiranatakusama and Prof. Genesis Kelly Lontoc.

Language and cultural understanding also become a key focus as **Universitas Muhammadiyah Makassar, Indonesia**, and **Fu Jen Catholic University, Taiwan**, co-deliver a module combining intercultural communication and flipped language classrooms. Ms. Maharida and Dr. Ming-i Lydia Tseng are set to lead this initiative, providing students with practical tools for navigating cultural differences.
